First Reading — Those who honor and comfort their parents shall never be forgotten (Sirach 3:2-7, 12-14).

Second Reading — You are called into one body: Bear with one another; forgive one another; let Christ's peace control you (Colossians 3:12-21 [12-17]).

Gospel — Joseph rose, took the child and His mother, and fled to Egypt (Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23).



SALVATION IN DAILY LIFE

This Sunday is the feast of the Holy Family, which comes on the first Sunday after Christmas Day. Today's feast celebrates how the humanity of Jesus (including His entire family life) has brought saving significance into the daily rhythms of our human family life. The scriptures offer instruction and encouragement on how to share—within our families, parish families, and the wider human family—the love that God shares with us in Jesus. Selections from Sirach, Psalm 128, and Colossians encourage us to reflect divine love and thus find holiness in all our human relationships. The reading from Matthew's Gospel offers a living example of love in the actions Joseph took to protect his young family from danger and to nurture them within the larger family of faith of their time.

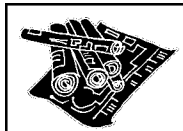

POWER MAD

King Herod was a nasty piece of work. Ruler of Judea under Roman occupation, he maintained his power by executing, murdering, or banishing anyone in his way, including his own family. Not being a Jew, he frequently broke the laws of Moses, enraged Jewish leaders, and extorted excessive taxes from a poor population. The Holy Family, warned of Herod's plot to kill all baby boys in Bethlehem, went to Egypt to escape. We can easily pinpoint so-called leaders and heads of states today who behave as disgracefully as Herod, raining down violence on their own people. Today there are over fourteen million refugees worldwide who have fled their homelands to escape atrocities. They survive in camps, dependent on aid agencies. After Herod died the Holy Family came home to settle in Nazareth. Many refugees today have little hope of returning home. Let us be grateful for our families and consider helping those displaced by war and bloodshed.

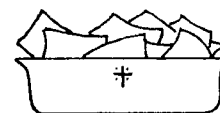

"Protecting God's Children" Requirement for Volunteers: All volunteers over the age of 18 working with children must be fingerprinted through the Diocese. Those working with children must also attend a class called "Protecting God's Children." Classes can be found online at www.virtus.org. Please call the Church Office if you have any questions.

Marriage: To schedule a wedding, engaged couples must meet with their Pastor at least 8 months before their proposed wedding date. Preparation for the sacrament includes attending a diocesan program such as Engaged Encounter or Pre Cana, and completing the FOCCUS Inventory. All couples of child-bearing age also need to take a full Natural Family Planning course. Pre-registration for each of these programs is mandatory for all marriages within the Diocese of St Augustine.

Baptism: Preparation must be made in advance and Baptismal Class for the parents is required. For the next Baptismal preparation class for parents wishing to have their children baptized, please contact the Church Office.

Sponsors for Baptism: Anyone asking to receive a document from the parish to be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation in another parish must be an active Catholic at OLGC. This implies regular Mass attendance and participation in the support of the community.

Sacramental Preparation for First Holy Eucharist/Reconciliation & Confirmation is a two-year program. Contact Tony Mouzon at 940-9938 or tonymouzon@aol.com for further information.
